**TOPIC: OSHA's new VPP Mobile Workforce Demonstration
Program for Construction.**

This presentation discusses the ins and outs of OSHA's new Voluntary Protection Program (VPP) Mobile Workforce Demonstration Program for Construction which became effective on October 1, 2006.

ASSE NEWS:

AMERICAN SOCIETY OF SAFETY ENGINEERS ANNOUNCE AVAILABILITY OF NEWLY REVISED CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION SAFETY STANDARD

ASSE recently announced the availability of the newly revised American National Standard Institute (ANSI) A10.6-2006 standard, *Safety Requirements for Demolition for Construction and Demolition Operations*, approved by ANSI on September 11, 2006.

The ANSI/ASSE 10.6-2006 standard is one of a series of safety standards that focus on construction and demolition operations. The latest version of the standard provides minimum requirements to protect and safeguard employees and the public and to prevent property damage that may occur during demolition operations as it applies to the demolition of buildings and other structures. The A10.6 standard also complements the newly reaffirmed ANSI A10.7-1998 standard, *Commercial Explosives and Blasting Agents—Safety Requirements for Transportation, Storage and Handling and Use*.

ASSE Professional Member Michael R. Taylor, CAE, and A10.6 subgroup chair, said, "Currently, OSHA, NIOSH and state, municipal and government agencies recognize the A10.6-1990 (R1998) standard. ANSI and the ASSE will work together to promote the newly revised standard among these agencies and others."

ASSE serves as the secretariat for the A10 Accredited Standards Committee on construction and demolition operations. The A10 standards serve as a guide to contractors, labor and equipment manufacturers in the construction and demolition industry.

OSHA NEWS:

OSHA Unveils New Guidance Document for Protecting Employees against Avian Flu

[OSHA Guidance Update on Protecting Employees from Avian Flu Viruses](#), and other important resource information on the topic, was recently posted to OSHA's Web site to alert employers and employees about the hazards of occupational exposure to avian influenza from infected birds, and provides practical recommendations on ways to avoid infection. This new document updates guidance on avian flu issued by OSHA in 2004. The update provides separate recommendations for poultry employees and those who handle other animals, laboratory employees, healthcare workers, food handlers, travelers, and U.S. employees stationed abroad. The primary focus is on good hygiene, including the use of gloves and hand washing, as well as respiratory protection for those who work with infected animals or individuals.

National Emphasis Program on Amputations Features Major Changes

OSHA recently revised its directive on the [National Emphasis Program on Amputations](#) to identify and reduce workplace machinery and equipment hazards which cause or are likely to cause amputations. Changes include identification of industries and establishments associated with amputations rather than equipment; lists of typical machinery and equipment associated with amputations; incorporation of a comparison chart for the Standard Industrial Classification codes and the North American Industry Classification System codes; and new targeting methodology based on more current data from OSHA and Bureau of Labor Statistics sources, and the Control of Hazardous Energy (Lock-Out/Tag-Out) and Mechanical Power-Apparatus Transmission standards related to amputation hazards.
