TOPIC: Proactive Safety Metrics that Drive Results in All Industries

The Safety Management Process (SMP) is a proactive safety program that was developed and implemented by Anne Bevington while she was employed by the Coors Brewing Company and resulted in over a 200% reduction in injuries over the past 5 years. The program does not focus on traditional metrics for safety such as OSHA rates and number of injuries, but instead is focused on employee participation and a proactive involvement in safety. The program is easy to understand and overall is a simple approach to a complex problem.

Most recently, Ms. Bevington was the EHS Business Area Manager at the Coors Brewing Company in Golden, Colorado where she just recently left to pursue other opportunities. TOPIC: COLORADO RESOURCES FOR PROTECTION FROM TERRORISM

The Colorado Information Analysis Center was designed as a fusion center that creates cross-jurisdictional partnerships between local, state, tribal and federal agencies to include private sector participants, when appropriate. provides a central point in Colorado for the collection, analysis and timely dissemination of terrorist-related information. The fusion center concept is integral to the DHS strategic information sharing initiative.

The Colorado Rubicon team is responsible for conducting vulnerability assessments on Colorado's most critical infrastructure and key resources (CI/KR). The assessments include detailed on-site inspections that encompass all-hazard integrated vulnerability assessments. Rubicon assessments focus on limiting casualties and structural damage to personnel and maintaining business continuity in the event of an attack or natural disaster.

The staff of the Office of Preparedness and Security will discuss current terrorism trends as related to the nation and the State of Colorado, as well as information sharing and critical infrastructure/key asset protection in relation to the Colorado Information Analysis Center (CIAC) and the Colorado Rubicon team.

Captain Brenda Leffler is a fourteen-year veteran of the Colorado State Patrol and currently serves as the Section Commander of the CSP Homeland Security Section and the Deputy Director of the Office of Preparedness and Security.

Captain Leffler was instrumental in the development of the Colorado Information Analysis Center (CIAC) and the Colorado Infrastructure Protection Project, which includes the Rubicon Team. Captain Leffler assists in the development of anti-terrorism products and provides courses and lectures across the nation in information sharing, critical infrastructure protection and anti-terrorism best practices and strategies.

Captain Leffler has an additional ten years of law enforcement and emergency medical experience from her service in the United States military. Captain Leffler has a bachelor of science in Criminal Justice from Metropolitan State College of Denver.

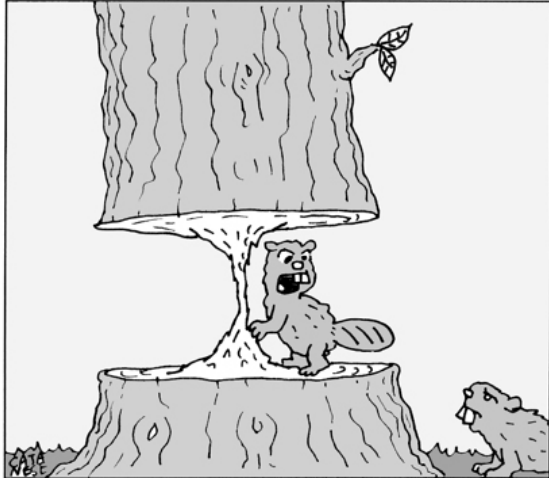

PRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND SAFETY

The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) estimates one in six working Americans have a drug problem, at a cost of \$60 billion dollars a year to American businesses. These costs come in the form of increased workman's comp claims, increased accidents, higher medical costs, and decreased productivity.

While many of the drugs used are illegal, many of the drugs abused are prescription and "over the counter". Workers need to be trained that overuse or abuse of illegal, prescription, and "over the counter" drugs can seriously impede their alertness, attentiveness, and ability to make coherent decisions. They are not only putting themselves at risk, but also their coworkers, and sometimes the public. Aside from direct safety risks, their efficiency and effectiveness also suffers.

Workers need to be responsible when taking prescriptions:

- When away from work because of an illness, a worker needs to let the supervisor know if current medications may affect their performance.
- Take medications at the proper time, in the proper dosage. Avoid mixing with alcohol or other drugs.
- Do not take expired medications, and do not share with friends or family members.
- Workers must know their limits. Tell supervisors if they are unable to complete a task.

Supervisors and coworkers need to be alert and watch for:
